What's Up Astronomically in 2019

Some of the more notable events in the sky for our area this coming year.

- January 21: total Lunar Eclipse about 5AM UT time or about 9PM Jan 20 MST.
- January 22: Venus and Jupiter close together in darker morning eastern sky.
- Last 4 days in Jan. and first week in Feb: International Space Station. In the evening western sky between 6-8pm. Exact times at Heavens Above. We are at 51N lat and 119W long. Say hi to David Saint-Jacques.
- February 27: week before and after to see Mercury in evening western sky.
- June, July, August: good viewing of Jupiter and Saturn in evening.

Watch this space for more updates on Meteor showers. If you are travelling in the southern hemisphere, then there are two solar eclipses and the other lunar eclipse to view.

Kingfisher Firesmart Steering Committee

The threat of wildfires to our homes and to our community is a reality of where we live. Firesmart, funded by our provincial government, provides clear simple recommendations and assessment tools to help reduce this risk.

On November 17th, Firesmart and RDNO hosted a Firesmart Information meeting at our hall. Since that meeting, we have formed a local Firesmart Steering Committee composed of 7 community members from the Halfway to the golf course. We met recently and decided on the following first steps.

- On Saturday, May 25, 12-2, we are holding a Firesmart Community meeting at the Hall to inform and involve the many summer residents who will be here to open their cabins and who were unable to attend the November meeting. All interested Kingfisher residents are urged to attend. We are hoping that Area F Representative Denis Delisle, Firesmart Educator Brandy Maslowski, and RDNO Protective Services Manager Alastair Crick will be able to attend.
- In conjunction with this we are hoping to have a Community Yardwaste Cleanup day on Sunday, May 26. We are hoping for extended dump hours and to have a chipper available.
- With a focus on Zone 1 (<10 m from homes and buildings) we will encourage use of the Firesmart assessment form. Check out the Firesmart website at <http://www.firesmartcanada.ca/firesmart-communities/provinces/british-columbia/>
- We have contacted Denis Delisle regarding the time frame for cleanup of the Beattie Road/golf course trail.

Denis Delisle response was prompt and favourable to all our requests.

While not in the mandate of our committee, we have sent a letter to Alastair Crick and to RDNO Director of Operations Mike Fox, supporting the need to develop a clear and safe evacuation plan for Kingfisher. Referring to the 2005 Evacuation Plan prepared by Dale Fennell, Mike Fox has responded that "the Regional District of North Okanagan is currently waiting for the appropriate grant funding that will enable us to update this document."

Working together our community can reduce wildfire threats.



Kingfisher Christmas Bird Count 2018

Weather and climate play a role in the birds and wildlife seen in our valley. This year's mild winter has resulted in some unusual sightings, the most striking being 43 American Robins in the Birch trees at our place. This is a first for our count. What will happen to them when the winter inevitably turns colder? Robins migrate more in response to food than to temperature; the abundant Mountain Ash and berry crops are perhaps keeping them hanging around.

Also new to our count were a Red Winged Blackbird and 20 Brown headed Cowbirds.

Among the thirty-five other species counted this year, there were about average numbers of Mallards, Common and Barrow's Golden eye, Bald Eagles, Great Blue Herons, Crows, Ravens, Black Capped Chickadees, and American Goldfinches. Once again, a Kingfisher made an appearance! A total of 766 birds were spotted.

The day after the count Keith Richards was in his gazebo around dusk when he had a visitor. He thought it was a hummingbird. Keith was reluctant to include this in the report as he couldn't make a 100% confirmation.

A huge thanks to Susan Everatt, once again, for being so gracious in hosting the post count potluck. As always it was fabulous!

Emergency Planning/Evacuation Update ***Submitted by Herb Latchko***

As we approach the New Year, there have been some positive developments toward revising the 2005 Evacuation Plan. In a response from Mike Fox, General Manager-Community Services, states: "*The Regional District of North Okanagan is currently waiting for the appropriate grant funding that will enable us to update this document.*" The December 14, 2018 issue of the Salmon Arm Observer ran an article about the Columbia Shuswap Regional District applying for a Community Emergency Preparedness Fund grant in the amount of \$25,000. "*A comprehensive plan is critical for large scale evacuations...*" "*The proposed evacuation route planning will build on the current plan and will incorporate additional layers of specific resources, communications planning, evacuation route mapping, considerations for aerial and water evacuations, mass transit and personal preparedness education.*" I assume our Regional District application will be similar. If you haven't already done so, please email Mike Fox at: mike.fox@rdno.ca and express your ideas/concerns in terms of revising our Emergency Evacuation Plan. If you would like a copy of the 2005 Evacuation Plan, email me at hlatchko@sd83.bc.ca and I will send you a digital copy.

As you will read elsewhere in this newsletter, a FireSmart Steering Committee has been formed as a result of the 17 November meeting at the Hall. It was decided that the FireSmart group would be separate from the Local Planning Groups (LPG). The LPG will still: continue neighbour to neighbour discussions/communications as to firefighting resources and tactics; pursue and participate in the Revision of the Evacuation Plan; and work with the larger community in terms of risk assessment and prevention.
