Mackenzie Camp To Go Online This Summer

On May 13, the Board of MacKenzie Camp made it official: after over 75 summers of continuous operations, there will be no over-night camping this year at the Mabel Lake site. Instead an online camp, MacKenzie Connect, is being developed to support the youth of the North Okanagan/Shuswap.

“We are all disappointed,” said Lana O’Brien, Camp Director again for this season. “Our camp, tucked away on Mable Lake near Kingfisher, is such a magical place. We desperately wanted to welcome area youth there again, but we simply can’t move forward at this time. Shifting to an online format is the responsible thing to do given the province’s current COVID-19 situation.”

“Camp is such an important part of so many kids’ summers, so we are working hard to find ways to replace at least some of that experience for them. We are developing an online format to connect kids through Zoom and we are building a collection of activities and challenges to support young people. We even intend to continue with some of our themed camps like science camp and arts camp. Another possibility that we are considering is to do a few in-person gatherings in church parking lots or other outdoor venues, so that ‘campers’ can get to know each other and their counsellors a bit better.”

Not surprisingly, moving to this new format will present obstacles for the camp.

“Online camp is brand new to us, so we are jumping into the programming side of things already,” said O’Brien. “I and three counsellors returning from last year have been hard at work putting a plan together. It’s exciting to see all the resources that are available as camps across the country and beyond respond to this COVID-19 health emergency challenge.”

Of course funding is also a concern. Weekly camp fees will be reduced to just \$15, only enough to cover registration costs. Other costs will have to be covered through other means.

The camp has long counted on the support of a dedicated corps of volunteers and patrons. MacKenzie Camp Association Treasurer and long-time camp booster, Lorraine Powell, is hopeful that such support will continue and maybe even expand this summer.

“Every year our supporters give generously so that kids who can’t afford it can attend camp, and we anticipate that this will happen again this season. We are also hoping that individuals and businesses in the North Okanagan and Shuswap will consider helping out. Each week, registered campers will receive a ‘MacKenzie Camp cares package’ filled with craft supplies and other materials for projects and activities. We would welcome any cash or in-kind donations from local individuals or businesses for our programming materials or to cover other operating expenses. And as a registered charity, we are happy to be able to provide tax receipts for this support.”

Area F RDNO Report Denis Delisle

The First Quarter RCMP Report is showing crime is up, with domestic violence/mental health issues are some of the main drivers. The officers were going to schools to talk about bullying with the "Pink Shirt day". They quit because of Covid-19; the virus has had other impacts on the officers as well. Cell blocks have been set up in such a manner that criminals are in separate cells to prevent the spread of the virus. Vehicles and many of the materials police handle are being disinfected. However, in their day to day interactions with people social distancing is just not possible and is a threat to the constables.

There had been 492 calls for service in the Enderby area in the first quarter of 2020, substantially more than any other area except Vernon. They do not know why it is so high but suspect many things could create this situation. One is being in the middle between Salmon Arm, Sicamous and Vernon bringing criminals to transit through the Enderby area. Another is there are locations that lend themselves to have criminals congregate in our area. These are difficult for police to shut down without substantial information and work. The police rely on information, and yes often it does not seem to do anything at first but over time it can help them. Any information you may have on criminal activity call **Crime Stoppers** at 1-800-222-8477. The Enderby area now has 24-hour servicing, and this has increased the ability for the force to catch bad guys. They are, as well, requesting 2 more officers for the area.

The Rural Economic Development grant application has been revised to emphasize rural economic development. The form has been revised to simplify the process for grant applicants as well. The RDNO allocates annual grant funding to organizations that support economic development within RDNO Electoral Areas. There is about \$18,000 that is available until September for projects that fit the criteria.

A variance is being applied for a dwelling on the east side of Mabel Lake. The request is for rear/side yard and floodplain setback.

The water is rising, and flooding is a concern, stay away from creek and river edges. The dryness is good for fires. Prepare for forest fires and clean up burnables around your buildings.

Thanks to A.I.M. for grading the entrance road to the Kingfisher Interpretive Center. We appreciate the Community support they give.

Despite the COVID-19 restrictions, technical planning for the new rail trail between Sicamous and Armstrong has moved ahead over the past two months. As part of a commitment to tell the true story of the region within the Secwepemc Nation Territory, preliminary assessments have been conducted by Splatstin leadership for both archaeological and cultural heritage values. Planning with geotechnical, environmental, agricultural, storm water, erosion control, steep slope, and structural bridge assessments is being continued. Mercury, elusively, makes an appearance around the 4th, about 24 degrees above the eastern horizon. Jupiter and Saturn in retrograde motion against the background stars. Both rise before midnight in Sagittarius and Capricornus respectively. Also, both appear close to the Moon on June 8th and 9th. Mars, Neptune, and Uranus are emerging at morning twilight.

Clear evening skies will highlight returning summer stars, like Vega, Arcturus, Deneb, Altair and constellations like, Cygnus, Lyra, Hercules, Scorpio, and Virgo. The fire season is approaching. This is a great time to locate and test your fire fighting equipment. Consider acquiring: a few more hoses and fittings; hand tools; a water storage set-up; or perhaps, even a fire pump. The efforts taken during the first few minutes of fire will have a huge impact on the effort needed to ultimately suppress and extinguish the fire.

Locals are the first line of attack. Talk with your neighbours. Share contact information. Be aware of the location and operational procedures of each other's equipment and water systems just in case they are needed if you are not home.

Make people's safety the highest priority when trying to put out a fire !!!
