

### **Fuel Load Reduction**

#### I have cut and pasted part of the text below:

The BC Wildfire Service anticipates a relatively normal spring pattern with cool conditions and scattered showers across much of the province.

Early season lightning fires are unlikely as the snowpack persists at elevation and continues to bury fuels that are otherwise receptive to lightning ignitions. The Interior is already experiencing valley-bottom grass fire activity (primarily human-caused) and the potential for early-season grass fires elsewhere will depend on the persistence of valley bottom snow.

Elevated drought conditions from fall 2022 will persist until significant and prolonged precipitation is observed.

### And again, cut and pasted text more specific to our area:

Rain over the Easter long weekend helped alleviate drought conditions in some regions including the B.C. Coast and portions of the Kootenays. The rain shadow effect of the Coast Mountains resulted in less rainfall over the Kamloops Fire Centre and the Cariboo where elevated drought codes persist.

The drought code mentioned above refers to the deep soils, which are very dry to the hotter and dryer fall last year. Once the soil is frozen, it is hard for it to absorb moisture through snow and spring rains.

Check for burning restrictions and venting conditions if you are considering burning

# MABEL LAKE PIONEER SISTERS CELEBRATE 100TH AND 101ST BIRTHDAYS

Noreen Acutt and Joyce Taggart, daughters of Joe and Alice Kass, the pioneers who started the Mabel Lake Tourist Camp in 1927 (now Mabel Lake Resort and Marina), celebrate their 101st (Noreen) and 100th (Joyce) birthdays in 2023.

Noreen's 101st birthday was celebrated at Tabor Court, Assisted Living residence in Abbotsford on March 17th. Joyce will celebrate her 100th birthday on May 17th at Maplewood House in Abbotsford.

Both ladies have fond memories of their Mabel Lake childhood, especially during the summer when guests would come to the Mabel Lake Tourist Camp. They recall many of the campers came from Armstrong. Their father along with his father-in-law Joshua Large built the first cabins which rented for \$1 a day! These two men also built the first round bottom boats that were used by guests for many years. Another summer recollection Noreen and Joyce have is of helping their mother make homemade ice cream using ice removed from Mabel Lake during the winter and stored in sawdust to remain frozen until the summer campers arrived. They also reminisce about their school days at the one room log schoolhouse with eight students and teachers Isabel Simard, Helen Glen, and Marjorie McMann. They recall the other students' names and even some of their birthdates! Another memory is what a special treat it was to go to the Armstrong Fair at the end of each summer.

Eventually their family moved to Enderby. Noreen returned to Kingfisher/Mabel Lake after her marriage to Harold Acutt in 1944. In 1959 they moved to Burnaby, B.C. along with their children Marlene and Gary. Joyce lived in Kelowna where she married Buss Taggart in 1947. Their daughters Linda and Pat were born in Kelowna prior to the family relocating to Prince George where son Peter was born. The Taggarts also moved to Burnaby, B.C. and later retired to Abbotsford, B.C. Noreen moved to Tabor Court Assisted Living in Abbotsford in 2018 where Joyce also lived before she moved to Abbotsford's Maplewood House in 2022.

Both Noreen and Joyce contributed stories for the publication Flowing Through Time, Stories of Kingfisher and Mabel Lake. Noreen wrote about the Acutts and Joyce wrote about the Kass family.

Their families treasure these two ladies and the stories they tell of growing up at Mabel Lake.
