



Fuel Load Reduction/Emergency Preparedness

June 2023

This article has been written on the 18th of May and hopefully the forecasted rain will materialize...

Hot dry weather; thunderstorms with little rain; and smoke in the valley brings back memories. This is a good time to talk and plan with your neighbours about how to deal with an emergency in your neighbourhood. Search: **Neighbourhood Preparedness Guide** for an easy-to-use downloadable template to assist in planning. There are some hard copy brochures circulating in the community with more on order.

The following was copied and pasted off the WildfireBC website:

KAMLOOPS – Effective at 12 p.m. (noon) PDT on Thursday, May 18, 2023, Category 2 and Category 3 open fires, as well as other equipment and activities will be prohibited throughout the Kamloops Fire Centre.

This prohibition does not ban category 1 campfires that are a half-metre high by a high-metre wide or smaller and does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane, or briquettes. More information on the types of open burning is available online.

Also prohibited are the activities listed below (Wildfire Act, Section 12): Fireworks Sky lanterns Binary exploding targets Burn barrels or burn cages of any size or description. Air curtain burners

Although burning to reduce the fuel load is no longer allowed, removing any fine fuels near your home can make a huge difference in the event of embers drifting in from a nearby fire. The Kingfisher Transfer Station accepts small amounts of yard waste, but larger quantities are encouraged to go to Armstrong. Composting is also an option.

Thanks to everyone that have put out their Fire Barrels. The first of the over 40 barrels went out in 2016. The Regional District has chipped in half the cost of the barrels, buckets, and decals. Over the years, Keith Gray and Brad Clark have been putting out, filling, collecting, and storing the 8-10 community barrels. We are hoping that someone might be willing to help out and eventually take over these tasks. Also, Brad has developed the Fire Suppression Water Filling Station (non-potable water) near the Ball Park. He uses this Station to fill his tank and then fill the remote Community Fire Barrels. The Station is fairly easy to use and can be a real asset when water is needed for fire suppression. Brad is willing to show people how to use this simple gravity system he has created. If you would like a demonstration and or would like to help with the Fire Barrels, please call Brad at 250-838-6326...
