REPORTING PROBLEMS ON MABEL LAKE RD.

STEP 1 Call AIM 1-866-222-4204* or fill out a service request on aim-roads.ca *Staff takes calls during business hours, 7-3:30pm. If they're on another call or if it's after business hours your call is forwarded to a Call Centre and gets dealt with in order received. AIM is under contract to follow up and reply.

If there is no resolution, only THEN go to STEP 2.



Call Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure Reception 1-250-712-3660 (Reception for both Okanagan/Shuswap and South Okanagan)

* It's important that you've first tried with AIM and had no resolution. The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure Road Area Manager (RAM) oversees AIM and deals with specific, unresolved complaints. If you call the Road Area Manager first you will be bounced back to AIM to start there. Reception will give you our Road Area Manager's contact phone number. Best to go through the reception at 1-250-712-3660 to avoid problems like a change in RAM phone number or possibility our RAM is away from the office.

Fuel Load Reduction/Emergency Preparedness

Safety First !!! There was a memorable sign on the gate at the Vernon Forestry Yard. This was before Wildfire BC became a separate identity and moved to Predator Ridge south of Vernon. As you were leaving the Yard, the sign read something like: "Your most important job today is to come back". A whole hillside of timber and or homes is not worth the loss of life. Fires are extremely dynamic and can change behavior quickly. Sudden wind gusts can make them out runnable. Fires moving up hill (usually during the daytime) are very dangerous and working there should be avoided; rather work the flanks. Working around dead trees can be deadly. Keep 4 meters from another person when working with hand tools. Going into a burning build is not like one sees on TV. Do not attempt to put out a fire caused by a downed powerline until you have heard from Hydro that the power has been turned off. And, after leaving a helicopter don't wave goodbye.

It's still not to late to reduce the fuel load around your home. Remove debris especially in that very important 1.5 meters zone closest to your buildings. The space under decks with spaces between decking should be regularly cleaned. Check out **FireSmart BC** for many simple things to do which can make a big difference.

As mentioned in last month's newsletter: "Planning with your neighbours will make a huge difference in an emergency. The Province has a great booklet to assist in the planning. Search: Neighbourhood Preparedness Guide for an easy-to-use downloadable template." Also, the Wildfire Service of BC site has a "Current Wildfire Situation" link. This is an updated version from last year's. It has a tremendous amount of information but takes some patience to navigate. Like the previous version, you can enter your address and your location will appear on a map. It takes awhile for the map to come into focus. Here is the URL if you want to get directly to the map: https://wildfiresituation.nrs.gov.bc.ca/map

You may have been hearing discussions about staffing many more year-round crews to deal with actual fire fighting when needed and doing mitigation work around communities to reduce the fuel loads during the shoulder seasons. Wildfire BC is already moving to a year-round model. Having more crews on the ground could go a long way towards not only fire fighting but getting serious about reducing fuel loads near communities.

Brad Clark has made his 900 L tank and pump available if you need it to fight a fire. He also has the Water Filling Station, near the Ball Park, ready to go. Please call Brad at 250-838-6326 to arrange for a short In-service on how to take advantage of these resources.

BABY WELCOME FUND


The Kingfisher Community Society is pleased to announce the establishment of a Baby Welcome Fund.
