PROPOSED MOSQUITO SPRAYING FROM KINGFISHER TO MARA. THE PROPOSED BYLAW INVOLVES MOSQUITO SPRAYING FROM APRIL 2024 TO MARCH 2029. IT ALSO WILL BE A COST INVOLVING PAYMENT THROUGH OUR TAXES.

I recognize that not everyone has the time or the inclination to go to the RDNO website and find out what is going on. It is not necessarily an easy site to access or travel through to get information. However; there are things that are happening that will affect Area "F" residents and as time permits, I hope to offer the information in a more simplistic way so people can understand what is going on.

There is an application from Area "F" to provide mosquito control for the properties along Shuswap River, from Kingfisher to Mara. A consultant has been engaged to create a plan for mosquito larvae growth control (through biological controls), a report should be coming out at some point in the future. The timeline for the proposed bylaw would start in April of 2024 and extend to march 2029. The amount requested every year for the new service would be \$289,000, or \$0.17 per \$1,000 of taxable land and improvements, whichever is greater. The average residential assessment was approximately \$591,000 in 2023, the maximum tax requisition, tax impact would be about \$99.95 per year, starting in 2024. It may not be that high but it cannot go any higher than that amount without going back to the taxpayers

Next steps are that the bylaw needs to receive statutory approval by the Province and be approved by the taxpayers of Area "F" through a Alternate Approval Process.

The Alternate Approval Process is a system, where rather than having to go out and vote for or against a new bylaw (as in a referendum), the onus is put upon the residents to fill out a "Elector Response Form". Citizens would have to get the form from the RDNO. The forms are available from the Regional District office for pick up or they can be faxed, mailed, or e-mailed to an elector. Conversely, if less than 10% respond the bylaw would be passed.

Depending on the chemical used, as well as if aerial or truck-based spraying, I still think this to be a terrible idea. Plus the process seems to be 'stacked', as one needs to provide their comments via an Alternate Approval Process by contacting RDNO for a form to fill out! I think people need to be aware of this!

Affecting one lifeform affects other lifeforms in biological systems! Let alone the Shuswap River hosts 5 salmonid species. Rainbow Trout spawn in the spring when this type of spraying would occur, affecting their food source. The spraying would affect all insect forms which are food sources, not just mosquitos.

Response by RDNO representative:

The RDNO is in the process of establishing a mosquito control service for Electoral Area "F"; however, before the service can be established, the approval of the electors must be received. An alternative approval process (AAP) will be undertaken later this fall.

Before the AAP can begin, the Board of Directors must:

- establish the deadline for receiving elector response forms,
- · approve the elector response form, and
- · make a fair determination of the total number of electors to which the AAP applies.

It is anticipated that a report outlining the above requirements will be on the November 15, 2023 Board of Directors agenda. After which, notification in accordance with the Community Charter is required, and the AAP timeframe can begin.


