### **REPORTING PROBLEMS ON MABEL LAKE RD.**

STEP 1 Call AIM 1-866-222-4204\* or fill out a service request on aim-roads.ca \*Staff takes calls during business hours, 7-3:30pm. If they're on another call or if it's after business hours your call is forwarded to a Call Centre and gets dealt with in order received. AIM is under contract to follow up and reply.

If there is no resolution, only THEN go to STEP 2.

#### STEP 2 If no resolution:

Call Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure Reception 1-250-712-3660 (Reception for both Okanagan/Shuswap and South Okanagan)

\* It's important that you've first tried with AIM and had no resolution. The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure Road Area Manager (RAM) oversees AIM and deals with specific, unresolved complaints. If you call the Road Area Manager first you will be bounced back to AIM to start there. Reception will give you our Road Area Manager's contact phone number. Best to go through the reception at 1-250-712-3660 to avoid problems like a change in RAM phone number or possibility our RAM is away from the office.



### **Fuel Load Reduction/Emergency Preparedness**

Cooler temperatures and recent rain has greatly reduced the threat of fires in our area.

At the time of this writing, campfire bans are still in effect. Campfires are considered **Category 1 Fires**, which are defined to be any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide. **Category 2 Open Fires** are 1 to 2 concurrently burning piles (each no larger than 2 metres high and 3 metres wide) and stubble or grass burning over an area less than 0.2 hectares **Category 3 Open Fires** are any fire larger than 2 metres high and 3 metres wide; 3 or more concurrently burning piles each no larger than 2 metres high and 3 metres wide; 1 or more burning windrows; and or stubble or grass burning over an area greater than 0.2 hectares. When allowed, Category 2 Open Fires do not require any registration, but Category 3 Fires do. Go to **OpenBurningBC** for more information. It's worth noting that before burning attempts to compost or taking material to a facility (Armstrong) should be made.

Premier David Eby has issued a statement regarding the launch of an expert task force on wildfires, drought, heat, floods and other emergencies affecting the province. I have cut and pasted some of it below:

"Based on feedback we have already received, the expert task force on emergencies will provide advice to increase local volunteer recruitment, to further collaborate with communities and First Nations, to incorporate municipal firefighting and other emergency forces, to deploy enhanced technology, and to provide constant support to those on the front lines. The task force will also provide ways to address the need for more accessible support for evacuees, with specific attention to timely access to shortterm financial supports and accommodation...It was also clear to me that we could be doing a better job of leveraging local knowledge and expertise when it comes to preventing and fighting wildfires." ... Hopefully this Task Force will encourage cooperation and safely improve fire fighting efforts.

Please consider helping with the taking down and storing one of the Community Fire Barrels near you. Also, it would be helpful if someone wants to help with the taking down and setting out the Community Fire Barrels.

In addition to using Alertable, the RDNO will continue to post all emergency notifications on their website and Facebook page, and through news releases and local media outlets, keeping the public informed during emergency events.
